10 Warning Signs

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MEMORY LOSS

Forgetting recently learned information. Forgetting important dates or events. Asking for the same information over and over. Needing to rely on memory aids (reminder notes or electronic devices) or family & friends.



PLANNING OR PROBLEM SOLVING

Some may experience changes in their ability to develop and follow a plan or work with numbers. They may have trouble following a familiar recipe or keeping track of monthly bills. Difficulty concentrating & take longer to do things than they did before.



DIFFICULTY COMPLETING TASKS

Some find it hard to complete daily tasks. May have trouble driving to a familiar location, managing a budget at work or remembering the rules of a favorite game.



CONFUSION WITH TIME / PLACE

May lose track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. May have trouble understanding something if not happening immediately. May forget where they are or how they got there.



PROBLEMS WITH VISUAL IMAGES

Vision problems can be a sign of Alzheimer's - difficulty reading, judging distance, determining color or contrast, which may cause problems with driving.



PROBLEMS SPEAKING & WRITING

May have trouble following or joining a conversation. May stop in the middle of a conversation and have no idea how to continue or may repeat themselves. May struggle with vocabulary, or problems finding the right word or call things by the wrong name (e.g., calling a "watch" a "hand-clock").



MISPLACE THINGS RETRACE STEPS

May put things in unusual places. May lose things and be unable to go back over their steps to find them again. Sometimes, they may accuse others of stealing. This may occur more frequently over time.



DECREASED OR POOR JUDGEMENT

Seniors with Alzheimer's can lose track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. They may have trouble understanding something if isn't happening now and may forget where they are or how they got there.



WITHDRAWAL FROM WORK OR SOCIAL

May start to remove themselves from hobbies, social activities, work projects or sports. They may have trouble keeping up with a favorite sports team or remembering how to complete a favorite hobby. They may also avoid being social because of the changes they have experienced.



CHANGES IN MOOD OR PERSONALITY

The mood and personalities of people with Alzheimer's can change. They can become confused, suspicious, depressed, fearful or anxious. They may be easily upset at home, at work, with friends or in places where they are out of their comfort zone.
