DETERMINING LEVELS OF CARE

There are 5 levels of care and the level of care for each resident is determined by the extent of personal care necessary, care provider expertise, number of employees needed to provide care and how much staff time is required to provide that care.

LEVEL 1 INDEPENDENT OR SUPERVISED

The resident only needs a place to live, laundry and room cleaning with meal service. There is very little that the resident will need to be provided other than one or two exceptions.

LEVEL 2 MINIMAL ASSISTANCE

The resident is ambulatory, continent and oriented to date, place, thing, and time. Is fairly independent and has no significant medical problems. May need some assistance with medication reminders, nutrition, hygiene, and activities of daily living skills.

LEVEL 3 SUBSTANTIAL ASSISTANCE

The resident has moderate medical problems and is able to perform some self care but may require reminding and general assistance.

The resident may have some memory and orientation loss and may need assistance with dressing and grooming tasks.

LEVEL 4 MAJOR EXTENDED OR INTENSIVE ASSISTANCE

Extended Care: Are non-ambulatory, have bowel and bladder incontinence, more assistance with medication management, eating, bathing, toileting, dressing & transferring. Have advanced dementia or other debilitating illness.

Intensive Care: Includes nursing care for catheterization, dressing changes, blood glucose monitoring and other diabetes care requiring services of a RN & nurse delegation. Other care needs include a two person transfer or heavy lifting. A Hoyer lift may be required. The resident is non ambulatory and has advanced dementia or other debilitating illness. Night wanderers, abusive or violent resident or those needing two person assistance in transfers may be beyond care in an Assisted Living. Also included are residents who need a special diet prescribed by their MD.



TOTAL CARE: HOSPICE DEATH WITH DIGNITY

Residents facing a life-threatening illness with no cure are included in this category.

However, hospice is no longer synonymous with death. Hospice provides for special care needs with emphasis on pain management to allow residents to live each day, pain free, to the fullest until death.

The Hospice program is ordered by the resident's doctor. Orders are for skilled, compassionate nurses utilizing pain control and comfort measures.

Hospice workers coordinate all resident care with the family, loved ones, responsible parties or professionals in an Assisted Living Home setting.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Programs such as VA Aid and Attendance and Star+ Waiver are available to qualifying personnel, for prospective funding assistance.
